



DYNCORP INTERNATIONAL STATEMENT REGARDING SENATE HOMELAND SECURITY AND GOVERNMENT REFORM AD HOC SUBCOMMITTEE ON CONTRACTING OVERSIGHT HEARING ON AFGHAN NATIONAL POLICE TRAINING

April 15, 2010

DynCorp International (DI) welcomes today's hearing of the Senate Homeland Security and Government Affairs Ad Hoc Subcommittee on Contractor Oversight and its examination of the issues related to Afghan National Police Training. The U.S. Government and contractors each play a vital and interdependent role in developing institutions on which Afghanistan's people can rely. We congratulate Senator McCaskill for her leadership on this critically important topic.

DynCorp International is a leading global government services provider. Our primary focus is to serve government customers in support of U.S. foreign policy and national security objectives. We treat that work as a privilege, and believe that transparency and accountability are just as important as performance and project completion. We compete to support defense, diplomacy and development. We do not build satellites or design aircraft. One of our core competencies is training and mentoring security forces, building capacity, strengthening the rule of law and providing access to justice. And we do it well, with years of hard-earned experience in the Balkans, East Timor, Haiti, Sudan, Liberia, Iraq and Afghanistan. Over 6000 experienced civilian police advisors have been provided by DynCorp International in support of U.S. Department of State International Civilian Police (CIVPOL) programs in 11 countries.

Our police advisors serve for one year, and approximately 60% remain for a second year. This dedicated service, besides providing continuity, allows us to further develop and maintain professional relationships with our Afghan counterparts. They face professional challenges and personal risks. To date, 37 DynCorp International employees supporting our civilian police missions, including 6 in Afghanistan, have made the ultimate sacrifice in support of the important mission worldwide. (Company-wide 65 DynCorp International employees have died in the line of duty.)

DynCorp International works relentlessly to be a responsible partner. As such, we seek not only to be responsive to the direction of our customer, but to anticipate and act upon questions, concerns, and possible challenges impacting on our mutual efforts.
